2009 Dark Sky Award

On August 19, United Astronomy Clubs of New Jersey (UACNJ) presented its Third Annual Good Lighting Award to Mayor Louis Lanzerotti and the Township of Harding. The award, presented to an individual, group, or organization that makes extraordinary effort to preserve dark skies, was presented to Mayor Lanzerotti and former mayor John Murray representing the Township of Harding. The award recognizes the consideration of good lighting design and the effort extended to utilize illumination fixtures that cut glare, eliminate energy waste, and maintain dark skies over the new township hall, library, and skating rink. The results

of this effort allow the skies over Harding Township to remain one of the few spots on the U.S. eastern seaboard that is free of light pollution. The resulting dark skies are a quality-of-life benefit shared by all who live in and pass through the township.

This award is particularly meaningful in 2009, the International Year of Astronomy. It was presented by Sherwood Waggy, the UACNJ Dark-Sky Chairman, and last year's winner, Nic Platt of Hartley Farms Partners, In an era of near universal encroachment of electronics and technology, every effort to maintain clear, dark skies and glare-free lighting while saving energy is noteworthy, and this example by Harding Township is clearly the best our organization has found in the state for both effort and results.
