TOTAL LUNAR ECLIPSE

New Jersey will be treated to a total lunar eclipse next month, the first in nearly four years.

Ignoring the penumbral phases, the eclipse begins at 1:57 AM on Tuesday, April 15. The Moon is completely immersed in the Earth's shadow and totality begins at 3:06 AM. Totality ends and the Moon starts to emerge at 4:25 AM. The final partial phase will last until 5:30 AM.

There will be another opportunity to view a total lunar eclipse on October 8 but the view from NJ won't be as good.
