#### **OBSERVATORY DEDICATIONS**

A commemorative plaque has been installed on the Brady Observatory which was donated to UACNJ by Maureen Brady. The donation of her late brother Kevin's astronomy equipment, included the observatory with an electric rolloff roof and a seven-inch Astro-Physics telescope. The Brady Observatory saw first light at Jenny Jump in August 2010.

The UACNJ Board recently voted to name the remaining observatory in honor of long time volunteer Lonny Buinis. Lonny is one of the founders of UACNJ and presented the first public program in October 1993. He continues to present the first program of each month, now numbering nearly 200 presentations. The newly named Buinis Observatory houses a 16-inch Meade telescope and Mathis mount which were also donated by Maureen Brady. This observatory is open during our public programs when the weather allows. Lonny and his wife Jan are familiar faces at Jenny Jump and valued volunteers of UACNJ.

A commemorative plaque has also been installed on the Buinis Observatory and a dedication ceremony for both observatories will be held on August 6.

# **TELESCOPE UPDATE**

Observers wishing to qualify on the 7-inch Astrophysics telescope in the Brady Observatory and the 16-inch Meade in the Buinis Observatory can contact Chris at membership@uacnj.org. Qualified Observers are needed to operate these telescopes during our public programs and can use them for personal observing at other times.

Amateur Astronomers, Inc. (AAI) has installed a new C14 Edge telescope in their observatory at Jenny Jump. AAI volunteers are on hand for most of our public programs so be sure to check it out.

Skylands Stargazers (SSG) and North Jersey Astronomical Group (NJAG) are now sharing the SSG Observatory at Jenny Jump. UACNJ volunteers helped them install a new pier. The observatory has a C14 telescope (photo at right) and is cleaned up and ready for action.
