OTHER NEWS FROM UACNJ

WHAT WE'VE BEEN DOING ALL WINTER

Thanks to the generosity of our many donors, we have been able to complete several projects during the months when the observatory was closed. Among them:

- Emergency lighting has been installed on our observing field
- A public address system which can be used both outside and in our lecture hall has also been installed.
- Materials have been purchased to create new signs to direct people to our location and advertise our special events
- With assistance from New Jersey Institute of Technology, a storage container has been acquired to house telescopes and equipment in an watertight environment.
- Refurbishment of our Greenwood Observatory and its CAVE telescope will be completed in time for our 2019 season.

UACNJ has taken possession of the 25" telescope which was donated by Alan Midkiff. Construction of the new 16' x 16' observatory to house this instrument is moving more slowly than we had hoped. However, we are lucky to have Peter Karcher as our contractor. He is working with our volunteers to reduce the cost of this project by using volunteer labor whenever possible. Let us know if you would like to help!
