

Come to the Mars Astro-Vaganza

Hosted by the New Jersey Astronomical Association of High Bridge, the last major Mars opposition of this century will be the first event sponsored by the newly formed United Astronomy Clubs of New Jersey, the state-wide support group for all New Jersey astronomy clubs. The Mars party will be held on Friday, November 23rd (rain dates the 24th and 25th). It is open to members of all UACNJ astronomy clubs and their invited guests.

There will be several speakers such as Dr. Carlos Hernandez, ALPO Mars Recorder, discussing his ALPO connections, and Eric Jacoves of the Sheep Hill Astronomical Association speaking about the inner planets, emphasising Mars. Large screen video programs will also be available for viewing between presentations. Many telescopes will be trained outside the observatory on the red planet including some older instruments ... Bruce Wingate's six-inch 'Clark' refractor, for instance. Telescope events: Deep sky observing 7 p.m.; Mars viewing around 8:30; and lunar madness at 11. Mark your calendar.

The creation of a master list of speakers for use by all member clubs was next discussed. A master list of Dark Sky Observing sites was also mentioned.

The Astronomy Day Open House and symposium, April 20, 1991 at Amateur Astronomers, Inc. and "Star Quest", the telescope weekend convention run by the Amateur Astronomers Association of Princeton, held in June of 1991, were the next two events discussed for UACNJ sponsorship. It was also suggested that some of the smaller clubs might get involved in some of these events. Andy Monka (SHAA) expressed interest in his club running the used telescope and optics table at the Astronomy Day event.

Light Pollution in New Jersey

Fred Schaff, of the South Jersey Astronomy Club, has just made available his "Light Pollution Update", a set of extensive notes on developments during the first eight months of 1990 about light pollution events which impact New Jersey astronomers.

The primary topics discussed are: The New Jersey Light Pollution Study Commission Bill S-2608, The Public Interest Research Group, and Amending the Municipal Land Use Law; Discussions with the ANJEC - the Association of New Jersey Environmental Comissions; Fred's presentation to AAI and conversations with Dark-sky activists; The Sands Casino laser skyillumination problem; and "Night Out", an anti-chrime program where everyone is to shine lights in the sky for an evening. A copy has been sent to each UACNJ representative to be posted.
