# Light Pollution Bill

Here is a history of New Jersey State Senate Bill S-2608 and State Assembly Bill A4294, the bills to establish a Light Pollution Study Commission. The bills are identical in wording.

Dec. 3, 1990	S-2608 passes the State Senate
	Environmental Quality Committee.
May 20, 1991	S-2608 passes the State Senate by a 29 - 2 vote.
Dec. 5, 1991	A-4294 passes State Assembly Energy and Environmental Commission.

We have asked State Assembly Speaker Joseph Doria, who supports the bill, to post the bill for a state assembly vote in time for passage this year. Timing is essential. Please urge your club membership to contact their assembly person who serves your district and ask them to support the bill. The current session of the Legislature ends at noon on January 14, 1992, after which, should bill A-4294 not be passed, the process will have to start all over again.
